

## Sound Bytes for Computer alerts

Want your computer to talk back to you in *Coeur d'Alene*? The following sound bites are available as audio clips that you can install on your hard drive; the instructions are below. You can use them to replace the default sounds on your computer that announce alerts, for example (including all of the Windows sounds\*).

The *Coeur d'Alene* terms in the left-hand column are what the audio clips are titled. Work backwards from the English translation to grab the audio clip you want.

e tech sti'm	'what's the task, my job?'	Exclamation
ch <sub>i</sub> nmsh ?	'what's the matter?'	Default Beep; Critical Stop
khwis chii	'what the heck?!'	Program error
hoy sits	'look out, what's this?'	Question
ku'm 'e'ynił	'of course!'	Default Beep
t'uk'wipmsh	'get started!'	Select
qhest twe skwitstm	'good morning'	Start Windows
ku 'ułchitspentkhwi'	'you're back !'	Start Windows
gwni <sub>k</sub> hw	'that's right, Right On!'	Default Beep
ah, qhest	'greetings; ok, good!'	Start Windows; Maximize
ni gwni <sub>k</sub> hw	'is that right?; is that so?'	Restore Up
lut he'ytsmeysn	'I don't know'	
sti'm khwe	'what are you thinking?'	Program error
'i'ytspu'sm <sub>i</sub> nm		
hoysn	'I quit for today'	Exit Windows
ne' 'u'ltsgwichstmin	'I'll see you later'	Exit Windows; Close program
qhest q'we'np'	'the work day's over'	Exit Windows
chn shi <sub>p</sub> ep	'I'm finished'	Exit Windows; Close program
shet'iple'nt	'you take care of it'	Empty Recycle Bin
t'i' cheł chkhuy 'eni <sub>s</sub>	'it's time for us to go home'	Exit Windows
hoy ch'uł'enis	'let's go home'	Exit Windows
twi chn sell	'I'm confused'	Blocked Pop-Up Window; Menu popup
ni ku sell	'are you confused?'	Question
ni shił q'we'np'	'is it quitting time (yet)?'	Blocked Pop-up Window
t'i' hnmał'p	'coffee's ready' (Break time)'	Restore Down
t'i' hnmayayqn	'time for lunch'	
ku'pł sq'e'yshit'wes	'you've got mail'	Windows Messenger; New Mail notification

"Suggested Sound(s)" are just that. Feel free to assign the *Coeur d'Alene* expressions to your own needs and liking.

# Sound Bytes for Computer alerts

## Installation Instructions

\*Copy the *Coeur d'Alene* audio clips into a new folder you've set up on your computer.

Go to Start ==> Settings ==> Control Panel ==> "Sounds and Multimedia"  
(Note: in Vista, "Sounds" folder; then select the "Sounds" tab from among "Playback/Recording/Sounds")


Click on any of the Windows' functions (like, "Close program"). In the box below where it asks you to Name (the sound), choose "Browse" and select the audio clip you want from your new folder. You'll be assigning a *Coeur d'Alene* sound to that function, and hear the alert every time your computer performs it.

## A few extra steps for enabling the mail notification sound:


In order to enable a sound to play as notification of when you receive a new email, you have to activate that option in Microsoft Outlook. First, open Microsoft Outlook. Pictures of the steps are pasted below.

Go to Tools ==> Options ==> Preferences (tab) ==> E-mail Options... button (towards top of dialog box) ==> Advanced E-mail Options... button (towards middle of dialog box) ==> check the box that says "play a sound" ==> press "OK" 3 times to exit and save new settings. Note: Vista may be a little different.



**A few more extra steps to enable a “Reminder” audio to play for calendar reminders (if you use the calendar and alarms within Outlook):**

Go to Tools ==> Options ==> Other (tab) ==> Advanced Options... button (towards top of dialog box) ==> Reminder Options...button (towards bottom of dialog box) ==> this will bring you to the Reminder Options dialog box in which you'll check both boxes (regarding playing sound and displaying the reminder). Next, you'll need to assign a sound you want to play when a task or meeting is coming up, from that same dialog box, click browse..., locate and select the audio clip you want from the new folder you created with the Cd'A audio files. Once you've located it press the “OK” button three times to exit and save new settings.
