Study Table

Study Table is an opportunity for students to step into a quiet and safe environment to receive the extra help they may need in several of their classes. Study table is held Monday-Friday from 3:00-4:00 p.m. in the Johnson O'Malley Room (RM 320) at Lakeside High School.

In addition to providing ample time and space to get homework completed, Lakeside School District has opted to allow students who have excused absences to make up time during study table. To receive this time, the student must be either completing homework assignments or reading. For each hour they attend study table, LHS will remove one hour from their excused absences total.

University of Idaho Tutoring

Each year, the Coeur d'Alene Tribe's Department of Education enlists 8-12 U of I students from various subject areas to step into Lakeside High School to not only assist the teachers in the classroom, but to spend time with each student to ensure they are truly learning the material in each class. These tutors also attend Study Table on most Tuesday's and Thursday's.

College Visits

The Coeur d'Alene Tribe's Department of Education has determined that the best way to get students interested in college or vocational training is to take expose them to as many colleges, universities, and vocational schools as possible. Thus, each year we will be taking each grade level to a different college. In addition, we will be having a different college come down to LHS to give a presentation. Our goal is to get students acquainted with the idea of post-secondary education and what areas of study are available to them after graduation.

Academic/Career Fair

Each year, the Coeur d'Alene Tribe's Department of Education, with the help of Lakeside School District, provides the community and schools an academic/career fair. This fair brings in many of the local business and college and universities from around the Inland Northwest to present what their company or school has to offer. This is a great opportunity for both students and community members to experience what post-secondary education opportunities they have, but also what jobs could await them.

Bridge Programs

From time to time, the Coeur d'Alene Tribe's Department of Education is introduced to several bridge programs. These programs are put on by outside entities such as University of Idaho, Washington State University, or other companies who are patrons of the Coeur d'Alene Tribe. Upon receiving information about such programs, we will send home an application in the mail and introduce it to the students. These programs run both during and after the school year.
