What is Illegal Dumping?

Illegal dumping is leaving waste anywhere it doesn't belong—like forests, roadsides, or open land.

Commonly Dumped Items:

-  Tires & Auto Parts
-  Mattresses & Furniture
-  Appliances
-  Construction Debris
-  Household Trash & Hazardous Waste

Why It Matters!

WATER & LAND

- Pollutes streams and groundwater
- Blocks drainage and causes flooding

FIRE RISK

- Dump sites (especially tires) can ignite

HEALTH RISKS

- Attracts pests and disease
- Exposes people to hazardous materials, especially children

COMMUNITY COST

- Decreases property values
- Cleanup takes funding from other priorities

How Long Does Trash Last?

⌚ Decomposition times vary, but many everyday items remain in the environment for generations:

-  Plastic bottles — about 450 years
-  Styrofoam— hundreds of years
-  Glass bottles — up to 1 million years plus
-  Disposable diapers — about 450 years
-  Aluminum cans — 80-200 years
-  Plastic bags — hundreds of years
